Adopting ICT Solutions to Increase Productivity

Enabling High-Speed Connectivity for Businesses

"We will promote high-speed connectivity for SMEs.
It is difficult for SMEs to take full advantage of cloud
computing and data analytics solutions without highspeed Internet access.




We will **subsidise SMEs' fibre broadband subscription plans** of at least 100 Mbps (Megabits per second) and provide support for them to implement Wireless @SG services at their premises.

We will also ensure that more buildings have facilities to bring fibre broadband to their business tenants. We will *subsidise building owners for up to 80%* of the costs of *new in-building infrastructure*, capped at \$200,000 per building."



Fibre Connectivity Scheme & Wireless@SG




- 1) Promote high-speed connectivity for SMEs to enable Cloud ICT Solutions
- Cloud ICT solutions ideal for small, nimble, cost sensitive players
- Greatly improves user experience for cloud-based ICT solutions
- Enables wireless connectivity e.g. via Wireless@SG

2) Enable wider penetration of Wireless @SG over high-speed fibre connectivity

- With high-speed fibre connectivity, abundant bandwidth can be used for other applications
- Wireless services in particular are useful for SMEs, including for enabling hand held devices, customer use, etc.

Benefits & Conditions Fibre Connectivity & WSG Scheme



Benefits:

- Fibre Connectivity: 50% of the monthly recurrent cost of the, capped at \$120/month up to 24 months, or \$2,880 per site
- Wireless @SG: One-time \$2,400 for acquisition of hardware

Conditions:


- Qualify for iSPRINT support for the adoption of an ICT-based solution (excluding support of less than \$2,000 for COTS)
- Service plans of at least <u>100Mbps</u>;
- Applies only to SMEs that are <u>NOT</u> on fibre plans currently OR.
 If existing fibre plan is <u>LESS</u> than 100Mbps
- SMEs will be eligible to the Fibre Connectivity scheme <u>ONE</u> time only for the duration of the 3 year IPG period
- IDA to have audit rights



* IDA need to sign agreements with vendors before subsidies can be extended to them





Fibre Ready Scheme



Fibre Ready Scheme



- SMEs will benefit the most from the IPG Programme
- SMEs often sited in office buildings with poor access to fibre
 - Lead to long provisioning time
- Government will fund building owners to enhance the existing inbuilding infrastructure to facilitate fibre access by operators
 - Cable trays
 - Access Panels
 - Others (base on consultation with the BMs and Operators)
- Operators are still required to install the fibre
- Operators encouraged to conduct consolidated roadshows for buildings to drive SME / enterprise adoption – <u>linked to claims by BMs</u>

BO/BMs and Operators need to partner up to take advantage of scheme



Conditions for BO/BMs to Claim (Pending formalised process)

- BO/BMs shall commit not to impose any additional charges to tenants
- BO/BMs shall provide the necessary information, processes and documentation to telecoms operators for fibre service provisioning
- BO/BMs shall ensure that their contact number and email are valid and contactable during office hours
 - IDA will make these available on the IDA's website
- Multi-tenancy buildings with at least 5 tenants
 - Government buildings are excluded


